The Ask Programme

The Apprenticeship Support and Knowledge for schools and colleges programme (ASK) will be back for the new academic year to support schools, students and their families to find out about Apprenticeships, Traineeships and T Levels.



Swap Don't Drop

The WMCA's 'Swap Don't Drop' campaign will be aimed at targeting young people who may be confused, uncertain and at risk of dropping out of education.

However, some of the issues around students dropping out, may be related to the institution being the wrong choice and would be a deal breaker in the student staying where they are (i.e., didn't like teaching staff, too far to travel, didn't form friendship groups).

We will focus on delivering a content-led, advice campaign, where we will encourage students to consider all alternative options rather than dropping out, including switching institution and type of study.

On advice from Colleges West Midlands we will be running the campaign in two 3 week periods this year:

- November 6th for 3 weeks
- January 8th for 3 weeks
