It was agreed that the working group should develop a proposal on this to present to WMCA.</li> <li>Salla noted that WMCA EDI team and the WMCA Race Equalities Task Force representatives had reviewed the Devolution Deal proposal and provided some recommendations to ensure EDI is thoroughly considered.</li> </ul>	Recruitment working group to develop process and proposal

	The board discussed concerns around the current hostile attitude within the political leadership race nationally on "low earning" degrees, and suggestions of de-investing in cultural programmes. It was agreed that advocating for cultural education would be important and Chair could escalate this, including discussions with Government and the Mayor. 	<ul> <li>CLB members expressed concerns around lack of communications support for board activities, including social media and other advocacy.
